CONTENT OVERVIEW

Exercising “leadership” is not about being the one in charge or on the top of the hierarchy; rather it is about being the one, regardless of position, that recognizes and faces the most uncertain and critical challenges and mobilizes others to tackle them, with the intention of a brighter future and better world.

This 3-day leadership workshop exposes you to varied leadership paradigms to better understand what real leadership looks like. Through a mixture of plenary sessions and interactive workshops, you will have opportunities to learn effective communication skills to engage, motivate and mobilize peers towards common goals. You will also be exposed to innovative paradigms that can add value for business growth to create sustainable development.

By the end of the program, you will acquire a holistic and well-rounded appreciation of the importance of having an entrepreneurial mindset, the keys to effective communications, and how to be a good team player.

TEACHING FACULTY

The program will be led and facilitated by six **Teaching Fellows** from **Harvard University**.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

PLENARY SESSION

These 80-minute sessions will provide frameworks for building 21st century mindsets and skillsets, and engage participants in an intensive, high-level learning experience.

Discussion topics may include:

- What it means to be a “Global Change Agent”
- The Distinction between Power, Authority and Leadership
- Leading Creatively
- Being A Responsible “Self”
- Building Relationships in the Team

WORKSHOPS

Interactive in nature, the 80-minute workshops are divided into two sets: leadership and innovation; the former develops leadership knowledge, skills and goals, while the latter develops entrepreneurial thinking via creative hands-on ideation. Participants will have the opportunity to select ONE topic from each workshop set. Sample topics include:

1. Learning to Speak Your Mind

Leadership requires effective communications to engage and motivate stakeholders towards a shared goal. This workshop trains participants in the art of public speaking. Participants will learn principles of effective communications, including learning how to be fully present to your audience, and what mannerism to build confidence. They will also have opportunities to prepare and deliver a persuasive pitch.

2. Authentic Leadership

“Until you make the unconscious conscious, it will direct your life and you will call it fate,” Based on one of Harvard Business School’s most popular courses, this workshop is premised on the assertion

that self-awareness is the foundation for a fulfilling life, a growth mind-set, and an effective leadership style. Through interactive lectures and exercises, participants will learn how to gain an authentic, transformational leadership outlook, approach, and style offering an opportunity to transform their own leadership path.

3. Building 21st Century Skills

The 21st century has brought a new kind of workplace, in which individuals are encountered with complex, multidisciplinary, open-ended problems that don't come in multiple-choice formats or ready-made standard solutions. This workshop will enable participants to learn the mind-sets and practice the skills needed to walk into professional settings and tackle complex problems.

4. Creating Value through Design Thinking

Design thinking is a practical and creative problem solving approach, with the intent of an improved future result. Through a mixture of classroom learning and offsite exercises, this workshop will provide participants with an overview of the design thinking process, to develop a bias towards action.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

These 50-minute workshops are designed to advance participants' ancillary capacities in verbal, written and professional areas by providing them with knowledge, best practices and skillsets that will help them in their personal, academic and professional life. Sample topics may include: Essential Presentation Skills; Elevator Pitch; or Building Your Personal Brand.

SEMINARS

These 40-minute sessions serve as an arena for discussion and debate on emerging topics of leadership, innovation, politics and education. It is also a forum for participants to be informed and inspired to pursue living a life that will benefit others.

Sample topics may include: *Finding and Setting Priorities; Finding Your Definition of Success; How Not to Lose Your Identity; Balancing Expectations While Pursuing Your Dreams; The Importance of Your Network* etc.

PROFILE OF TEACHING FELLOWS



SAMUEL KIM

Samuel Hungsoo Kim, a Korean national, is the Co-founder and President of the Center for Asia Leadership Initiatives (CALI). He is passionate about nurturing and empowering talent in Asia and runs over 42 programs annually, in more than 27 Asian countries. His research and training focus on building social capital and trustworthy institutions; the effective use of power, authority, and influence; and negotiations, mediation, and confidence-building. To date, some 36,000 burgeoning and established leaders from the governmental, political, non-profit, and corporate spheres in Asia have benefited from his programs. He has worked for and with over 30 renowned organizations, including the United Nations, UNESCO, Samsung, and Toyota. He currently sits on the boards of three social-profit organizations and has served as a visiting fellow at the Asia Center at Harvard University and the Kellogg School of Management in Northwestern University. Samuel holds a Master's in Public Administration from the Harvard Kennedy School of Government; a Master's in International Cooperation from Seoul National University; and an LLB in Law, International Politics, and Economics from Handong University.



JOHN LIM

Faustino John Lim is the Co-founder and Director of International Affairs of the Center for Asia Leadership. A former fellow of the Harvard University Asia Center, he has worked in diverse organizations including the Embassy of Canada in Korea, the International Crisis Group, and in sectors such as English education and social entrepreneurship. In his work at the Center for Asia Leadership, his team developed a Harvard student project into a full-fledged leadership training and research organization that has benefited over 16,000 individuals in 22 countries through over 60 conferences and leadership programs. He also developed the Center's research and publication arm, advising the interviewing agenda of over 100 minister or director-level individuals from the public and private sector, resulting in five published books. He has also established the Asia Leadership Institute, developing a network of value-driven companies and NPOs, resulting in annual programs in six countries. His current work engages him in researching and applying various leadership, education, and entrepreneurial models and frameworks within Asian contexts.



ARIENNE CALINGO

Arienne Calingo is an alumna of the Harvard Graduate School of Education with a degree in International Education Policy. A former lecturer of Arabic language and Middle Eastern culture at Holy Angel University in the Philippines, Arienne is also the founder of LEAD: Leaders in Education, Advocacy, and Diversity, collaborating with local citizens to create education programs impacting the lives of over 5000 street children and indigenous Aeta children in the Philippine province of Pampanga. As a social entrepreneur and education advocate, Arienne has given talks on cultural diplomacy, diversity and inclusion, and international higher education at such venues as Harvard University, Georgetown University, Office of the Higher Education Commission of Thailand, Fulbright Thailand, and the British Council. She is the first woman to serve as EducationUSA Ambassador for the U.S. Embassy in Manila, having completed her undergraduate degree with honors from Georgetown University. Besides her extensive work in education, Arienne is a graphic designer, award-winning poet, inspirational speaker, ballerina, violinist, and self-taught pianist. She is left handed and, like most left-handed individuals, loves viewing the world through a creative lens.



MATTHEW TURNER

Matthew Turner is a professional trainer and community organizer with over ten years of international experience in community building and education. As a local university faculty member under the auspices of the United States Peace Corps in the Ukraine, he chaired programs and meetings among 10 community groups to promote civil society, he led the leadership programming for secondary school students, and led USAID-funded health and wellness camps for over 200 middle school students. While in Kazakhstan also under the U.S. Peace Corps, he supported strategic planning efforts while directing camps for local youth. In the United States and Chinese Taiwan, he designed and directed various language programs for business professionals and students, as well as training programs for teachers. While at Harvard University, he trained under Professor of Education Leadership Monica Higgins. Matthew holds an M.A. in International Education Policy from Harvard University.



ANUSHKA GHOSH

Anushka holds a Masters in Education from the Harvard Graduate School of Education. As the Program Lead at the Simple Education Foundation in India, she designed and implemented the training program for 97,800 K-8 government school teachers in the provinces of Jammu and Kashmir. As a Consultant and Researcher, she has served for USAID in South Africa to reverse the effect of Apartheid regime policies; created a curriculum on cognitive neuroscience and social emotional development for K-5 students, under the mentorship of Harvard University Professor Tina Grotzer; and created an interdisciplinary body across the Harvard community that ensures collaboration between all Harvard schools and centers on human rights, under the mentorship of Harvard University Professor Marshall Ganz.
